Message from the CEO



Welcome to the latest edition of Medical Matters and my first as CEO of Pindara Private and The Southport Private Hospitals. I have been with Ramsay Health Care for 19 years and I am very excited to be back at Pindara having worked here some 13 years ago. Thanks to

everyone in the medical community for making me feel so welcome.

Affordability of health care services is very much a focus at present and something that I know we all turn our minds to frequently. So, it is with much pleasure that I share with you that Pindara has partnered with South Coast Radiology to remove all out-of-pocket charges arising from imaging services provided to our Emergency Department patients.

A new robot has joined the ranks at Pindara to assist surgeons in providing non-invasive procedures for patients. The da Vinci Xi robot allows surgeons to operate through a few small incisions, with the use of a 3D visual system and tiny wristed instruments. It's expected the da Vinci Xi robotic surgical system will be used across a range of specialties with possible benefits to patients including less postoperative pain and decreased risk of infection following surgical procedures.

We are extremely proud of the rapid growth and development of the Clinical Trial Unit we established just last year at Pindara. The unit assists in the establishment of clinical trials to be undertaken at Pindara and is responsible for trial administration, patient involvement and care. Some of the trials currently being established or on offer include Non Hodgkins Lymphoma, Breast or Gynaecologic Malignancies and Prostate Cancer.

In our maternity service, a free 'Know My Midwife' program has been developed to provide mothers who will deliver at Pindara the opportunity to have

pre- and post-natal check-ups with the midwives who will attend their birth. A core group of Pindara midwives have been specially trained to deliver the program and will work in conjunction with Pindara obstetricians to provide an extra level of care to our patients. Work has also continued to upgrade our birth suites with our third beautifully refurbished suite coming on line late in 2018.

By the project's end, Pindara will have a total of five ultra-modern birth suites offering mothers a luxurious birthing experience, enhanced by the confidence that comes with access to expert staff and comprehensive hospital facilities. Recently the gardens adjoining the maternity unit have been completed, allowing patients to take in some fresh air and sunshine in a calm and relaxing environment. The birth suite balconies have been decoratively screened and trees planted close by to provide privacy.

After 18 months, renovations at Short Street Day Surgery have been completed with staff now enjoying their new space. The recent refurbishment of the Day Centre was designed to accommodate Short Street's growing team and to provide an opportunity for further expansion in the future. The refurbished area includes four new offices, a tearoom with views to the water, medical records storage, a reception waiting area, and a Ramsay Pharmacy.

There are many more exciting upcoming developments in the works across Ramsay Health Care's Gold Coast hospitals and I look forward to sharing these with you in future editions.



The Southport Private Hospital invests in the future of mental wellbeing

In its bid to meet increased demand from Gold Coasters and surrounding communities, The Southport Private Hospital has announced an investment of \$8 million to expand its mental health services.

Construction is currently underway at the hospital to double the number of beds from 24 to 48 in the mental health care unit.

In addition to the extra beds, the expansion allows The Southport Private Hospital to add a range of new speciality care services for patients seeking treatment for addiction, post-natal depression, eating and anxiety disorders.

The redevelopment will also include space for group therapy, art and music therapy, a gym and a sensory modulation area; an environmentally controlled space to reduce levels of distress.

The Southport Private Hospital Executive Officer Athol Webb said that since opening its doors in 2017, the demand for mental health and rehabilitation services has continued to grow.

“We are very excited about this extra capacity which will allow us to continue to provide care for all those who need specialist intervention and assistance,” Mr Webb said.

“The additional beds and therapy areas will enhance our current services to meet increasing demand to deliver contemporary, evidence-based practice. What we’re offering is more choice and a great standard of care for our patients.

“The sensory modulation area within the new mental health facility will have low level lighting, and strategic sight, sounds, smells, movement and items such as weighted blankets and massage chairs to complement existing therapies and further reduce stress and anxiety,” Mr Webb said.

Further to the extended therapy areas, additional psychiatrists will join the team at The Southport Private Hospital to cater to the specific needs of patients and to help with the roll-out of new targeted treatments.

Director of Community Psychiatric Services and the Day Programs Dr Philip Muller said the expansion demonstrates Ramsay’s commitment to deliver key services to the Gold Coast community.

“This expansion marks a significant milestone for private mental health services on the Gold Coast and will serve as the counterpart to Ramsay Health Care’s growing commitment to community psychiatry,” Dr Muller said.

Works are expected to be completed by February 2020. ■

Building skills and confidence in parenting through Baby Assessment Unit



Pindara Private Hospital's paediatric ward offers a multi-disciplinary, specialist child health service for families who require support and guidance with building skills and confidence in parenting.

The Baby Assessment Unit offers a paediatric nurse-led program which works in partnership with families to understand their needs and concerns. It provides expert advice with issues such as irritability, reflux, feeding difficulties and settling babies. A thorough history will be taken and any medical concerns raised will be addressed with a paediatrician.

The service offers multiple inpatient programs for families with children aged from birth to 12 months in conjunction with follow up phone consultations.

Parents can receive education and guidance for:

- Responsive settling
- Responsive feeding
- Breast feeding
- Bottle feeding
- Child development and behaviour

Staying at Pindara Private Hospital

Mothers and babies will be cared for by our experienced paediatric nurses under the guidance and support of a paediatrician. Generally the stay here is three days; the first 24 hours allow for staff to assess the child's sleep and feeding patterns and to develop an individual plan.

During the stay, we provide all meals for mother and baby, as well as nappies, bottles and expressing machines. We do advise parents to bring along their own formula if needed.

Midwives on hand for mothers at Pindara Private Hospital

New and expectant mothers at Pindara Private Hospital now have access to free pre and post-natal appointments with midwives, who will provide support during and after their pregnancies.

A group of Pindara midwives have been specially trained to work alongside obstetricians to deliver the 'Know My Midwife' program to maternity patients at the hospital.

Maternity Nurse Unit Manager Johanna Stevenson said: "While the care and service we provide has always been well received we wanted to do even more for our Pindara mothers, specifically in regard to pre and post-natal support, so this a great way to achieve this."

Patients who choose to birth at Pindara Private Hospital will have access to up to

four appointments prior to their birth with a designated midwife. This service also includes a comprehensive appointment at 20 weeks.

"It's an hour and half appointment and involves comprehensive obstetric, family, and social screening and assessment to ensure appropriate intervention, support, and referrals can occur," Johanna said.

After the birth, mothers are provided with a weekly appointment with their midwife for six weeks, with the aim of providing support and identifying any health or social issues.



"There is something about midwives; women open up to us and this helps to make this 'Know My Midwife' service really valuable for these mothers and their families," Johanna said.

Each year one thousand babies are born at Pindara Private Hospital.

Expectant mothers can be referred to the program by an obstetrician, General Practitioner or self-referral by contacting the Pindara Maternity Unit directly on 55889401 during office hours or by emailing:

Cost savings for emergency patients at Pindara



Emergency department patients no longer have to pay out-of-pocket costs for medical imaging services at Pindara Private Hospital, thanks to a partnership with South Coast Radiology.

The new initiative means people who seek urgent treatment at Pindara's ED could save hundreds of dollars on diagnostic imaging services.

Pindara Private Hospital CEO Mark Page said: "Affordability of health care is always at the forefront of our minds. We believe this initiative will be of great benefit to patients who will now save what could have previously been many hundreds of dollars in emergency imaging costs."

South Coast Radiology said the decision was made in an effort to reduce costs for patients, while increasing accessibility to health care.

Plans are now underway to achieve similar outcomes for inpatients at the hospital.

South Coast Radiology CEO Warren Berry said: "To achieve this we are undertaking a series of negotiations with all major private health insurance providers which we hope will prove successful."

Pindara Private Hospital's emergency department has tripled in size since it opened in 1987. More than 20,000 patients are treated at the facility each year.

New surgical technology arrives at Pindara Private Hospital

Pindara Private Hospital is among the first in Queensland who have invested in the latest da Vinci software, giving patients on the Gold Coast access to the most advanced medical technology.

The 'da Vinci XI' robot allows surgeons to operate through a few small incisions, with the use of a 3D visual system and tiny wristed instruments that bend and rotate. Surgeons have full control over the instruments during procedures, which are operated by their own hand movements.

Pindara Private Hospital's Assistant Director of Clinical Services, Tracey Clark, said: "We've got a navigated robotic knee system, but this is the first true robot where the surgeon is separated from the operating table, so they sit behind the console."

The da Vinci Xi was installed earlier this year and has already been very well received by the surgeons using it and the patients who have realised the benefits that arise from this world leading technology.

To date urology, bariatric and ENT procedures have been undertaken using the da Vinci Xi robot. It is expected that robotically assisted colorectal procedures will also soon commence at Pindara.

"We're very excited to be able to offer the Gold Coast community and surrounds the very best and latest in technology as an adjunct to the great care and service that I believe Pindara is well known for providing," Mrs Clark said.

It is anticipated the da Vinci Xi robot will be used well over 300 times each year with those patients likely to have less post-operative pain, a decreased risk of infection and a shortened stay in hospital. ■





Pindara Private Hospital launches a tiny car for children's surgery

Pindara Private Hospital (PPH) has launched a Tiny Car program for paediatric patients, which allows children to drive themselves between the pre-operative area and operating theatre.

The aim of the program is to reduce the stress and fear around surgery for children and their parents. It is part of PPH's ongoing efforts to make any hospital visit as comfortable and stress free as possible.

Anaesthetist Dr Tony McDougall said it is a great opportunity for the hospital to demonstrate it listens to its patients, taking not only their physical health into account, but their emotional health and wellbeing as well.

"At Pindara Private Hospital we are focused on delivering the best outcomes for all of our patients. Not only do we want the surgical experience to be as comfortable as possible, but we value the health and wellbeing of our patients at every level," Dr McDougall said.

"Over the years, we've recognised that for many children and their families, the unknown of surgery can be a frightening, stressful and often daunting experience. Through this Tiny Car

program, we want to remove some of this fear."

Tiny Car program coordinator and Assistant Director of Clinical Services at PPH, Tracey Clark, said the program demonstrates the commitment Ramsay Health Care has to all patients and customers who come through its doors.

"The Tiny Car program is the perfect addition to our repertoire of stress management tools to support our young patients and their parents at times when they need it most," Mrs Clark said.

"We want to be leaders in the space of patient care, and that involves maximising the comfort had by all of our patients."

The Tiny Car program builds on PPH's comprehensive private paediatric service adding to its dedicated, purpose built paediatric ward and ability to accept and care for children through its private Emergency Department. The initiative is part of PPH's future focused approach to patient care. ■

Ramsay Australia launches Net Promoter Score

Ramsay Health Care has launched a specific Net Promoter Score (NPS) survey for patients across its Australian hospitals including Pindara Private Hospital and Short Street Day Surgery.

NPS is a customer satisfaction metric that measures a customers' willingness to return for another service as well as to make a recommendation to their family, friends or colleagues.

It was first introduced in 2003 by the Harvard Business Review and has since been widely adopted by more than two thirds of 'Fortune 1000' companies and by top organisations across the world. It is a practical and reliable way of determining customers' satisfaction with a company's goods or services.

The score is calculated by subtracting the 'demoters' from the 'promoters'. The final score can range from -100 to 100.

Based on global NPS standards, 50 and above is considered excellent while 70 and above is considered world-class.

Head of Marketing and Customer Experience, Joel Bowerman said, while Ramsay had always surveyed patients about their experience, the new method provides the information back much quicker via a dashboard to the hospital administration. The data can be interrogated by ward, specialty or other metrics to see where improvements can be made.

Results for each Ramsay hospital participating in the NPS have been published on the home pages of their websites. ■

There are now 5,000 WiFi access points, which are 600 per cent faster; 230,000 connections are made to the WiFi network each month.



Pedalling proven to speed up recovery times for Total Knee Replacements

Research at Pindara Private Hospital has found pedalling exercises are much more effective than standard physical therapy in rehabilitating patients who have had Total Knee Replacement (TKR) surgery.

50,000 Total Knee Replacements are performed annually in Australia; this figure has grown by six per cent in the past year due to rising obesity levels, sporting injuries and an ageing population.

Despite the prevalence of the procedure, there is a lack of research around the best practice for patient rehabilitation.

Pedalling has often been recommended as therapy following Total Knee Replacement surgery, but there has been no formal investigation to prove it is effective.

Pindara Private Hospital senior physiotherapist Larissa Sattler said: “We completed a literature review as part of our research and there was a complete lack of data around Total Knee Replacement rehabilitation in the early period following surgery.”

An 18- month medical trial at Pindara Private Hospital has proven pedalling following Total Knee Replacement surgery significantly improves patient outcomes.

The trial compared the outcomes of 60 TKR patients, who were randomised to receive either self-directed pedalling or standard therapy exercises.

Patients were reviewed at two days, two weeks and four months by assessors who were unaware of which physical therapy each patient had received.

“Patients who had undergone the pedalling program were able to walk further over six minutes and there was better self-reported function and earlier discharge home,” Mrs Sattler said.

Specialist orthopaedic knee surgeon Dr Christopher Vertullo said: “We estimate there will be savings of over

\$25 million in direct medical costs due to earlier discharge home if there is an uptake of the pedalling therapy program throughout Australia.”

The research allows surgeons and physiotherapists to safely prescribe a self-directed pedalling program to their patients.

The authors plan to promote the research to other surgeons at the Australian Orthopaedic Association Annual Scientific Meeting in October. The findings will also be published in the Journal of Bone and Joint Surgery, which receives international exposure.

“Rather than saying ‘I think,’ what I can say now is, ‘I know’ that pedalling has better outcomes for Total Knee Replacement patients. It’s a powerful message we actually know, because we can prove it with the research,” Dr Vertullo said. ■
